### A Tie for Dad

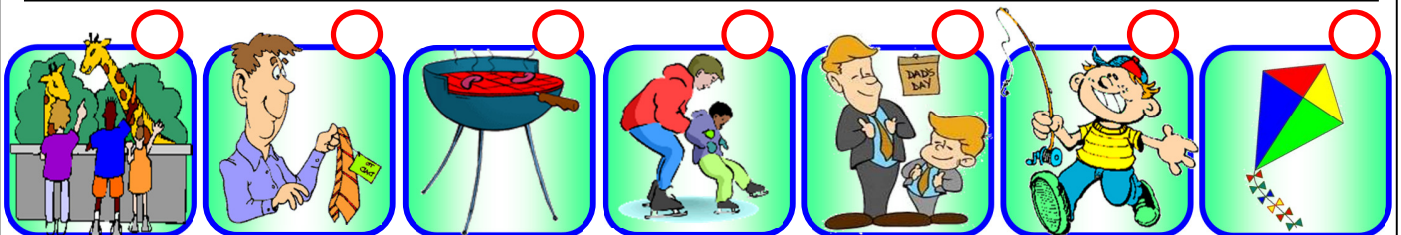

Father's Day Poem

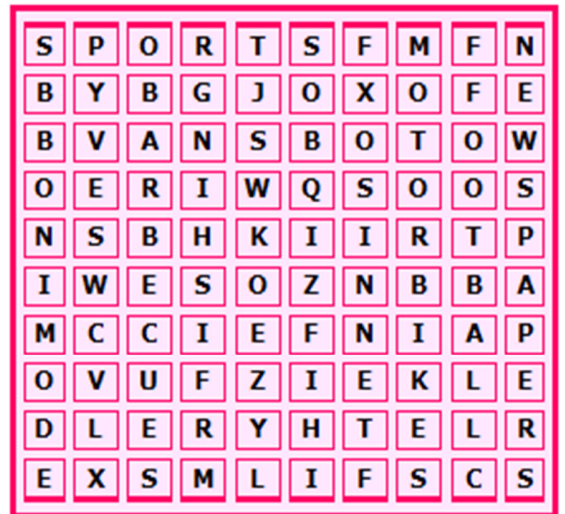
A dad is a person
