## Student Writing - Create a Creature

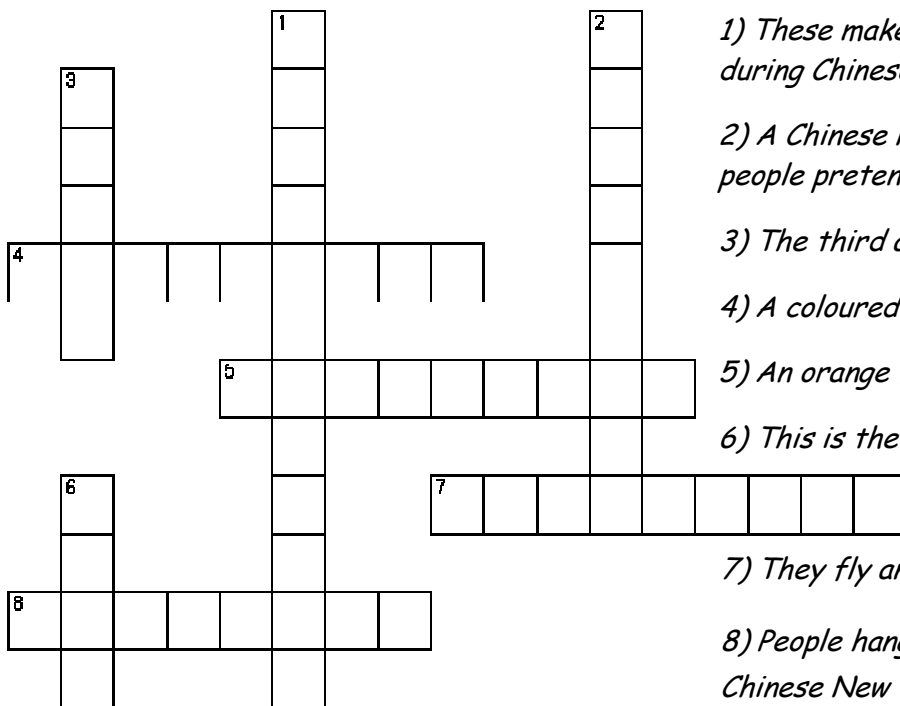
